### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES FOR THE COURSE

- 1. Demonstrate the effects of the principles of art on the elements of art.
- 2. Complete study questions for each element/chapter.
- 3. Display ability to participate in class critiques using knowledge of the elements learned from class lectures and classwork.
- 4. Students will compile a research paper on their favorite artist concentrating on the artist style and influences.
- 5. Complete three (3) 3-dimensional works of art using elements and principles of art to be displayed in the TC Student art show.

#### STUDENT ASSESSMENT

Grades will come from projects, tests and the research paper. Grades are influenced by creativity, attitude, meeting class on time, attendance, and co-operation and keeping work areas clean.

Tests are worth 50% of the grade. Major tests are based on information from the textbook and lectures and from study questions.

Projects are worth 50% of the grade.

Projects are scored from 100pts. each.

Due dates for projects are posted in the classroom and are subject to the progress of students. A letter grade will be taken off on any project not handed in on its due date. This also applies if you are absent the day they are due.

- 3. If the appropriate materials for the project were used.
- 4. If appropriate size was met
