Student Learning Outcomes for the Course:

Demonstrated Competencies:

- 1. Engage in the creative process and comprehend the physical and intellectual demands of a theatre artist.
- 2. Demonstrate practical application of uses of tools and techniques to visually realize theatrical designs.
- 3. Demonstrate the fundamentals of the design process by analysis and practical application of knowledge by realizing a design from all aspects.

Objectives:

Dual Credit Technical Theatre is an intensive, hands-on introduction to the understanding, designing, crafting and execution of theatrical productions. Our objective is to learn the basics of theatre terminology and to obtain the hands-on skills to properly execute theatrical productions. You will emerge from this course a better problem solver, carpenter, electrician and leader. Students are required to work a minimum of <u>12 hours outside of class</u> <u>time per semester</u> in the running of events. These 12 hours are in addition to the hour requirements you may have in other theatre courses, including Theatre Production.

Course Description:

Dual Credit Technical Theatre is a college-level course that will introduce the student technician to the areas of stagecraft and theatrical production. *You will build, paint, climb ladders, lift things and handle power tools in this class.* The theatre elements to which you will be introduced will include, but are not limited to:

All students are encouraged to participate in all theatre productions. The audition and performance dates will be announced in class and over Tigervision.

Students <u>MUST WEAR CLOSED-TOED SHOES</u> to participate in class. <u>You will take a</u> zero for a daily grade if you do not have appropriate footwear!

Mr. Hanna- Technical Theatre I General Course Requirements...

- I. View and evaluate one (1) live production event for each six weeks grading period. Videos of any kind, films, or T.V. shows are not considered live events. Each viewing/evaluation will equal one (1) test grade. You will turn in a program and/or ticket stub along with a 1-page, double-spaced typewritten critique about what the show was about and what technical aspects of the show you thought were great and what you thought did not work for the production. These critiques will be graded for grammar, spelling, punctuation, etc. Do not wait until the last minute to begin this requirement!
- II. Production/crew/ hours: all students are required to complete a <u>minimum</u> of 12 (twelve) crew hours per semester. The hours must be documented on your International Thespian Society point sheet and in the "Tech Sign-In" book in the booth. These hours will count as your final exams at the end of each semester. You are in charge of keeping up with your ITS point sheet. It's your responsibility to document and prove your crew hours through the "Tech Sign-In" folder in the booth.
- III. In accordance with the rules set forth by Texarkana College, there will be a **cumulative exam** at the end of each semester. (This will usually take place the week prior to high school semester exams.)

Notes on Production Hours :

- 1. When the twelve hours are completed, the student must stay on and faithfully complete the remainder of their crew responsibility until the end of the production's run.
- 2. Students may elect to receive credit for serving as crew for a Tex*Rep production with <u>prior</u> approval from Mr. Hanna.
- 3. These hours are accrued only when serving in a technical capacity you will not receive crew credit for acting, singing, dancing, etc.

GRADING AND ASSIGNMENTS

Students are expected to turn in their assignments ON TIME. Late work will not be accepted. Tests and projects will count as 50% of your six week average, daily and homework grades will count as the other 50%.

CLASSROOM RULES
