#### **ABSENCE POLICY:**

Texarkana College's absence policy allows instructors to withdraw a student from a course due to excessive absences. Attendance will be taken on a weekly basis. If you do not complete any assignments during the week, you will be considered absent for that week.

A student should not stop attending a class without formally withdrawing from the course by the institutions published Last Day for Students to Drop.
