CLASSROOM ETIQUETTE:

This is a college classroom, not a social club. Most students know how to act in a college classroom, but a few do not. Those students who are here to learn deserve a classroom environment conducive to learning, and that is what I intend to create. Therefore, I expect each student to treat classmates and the professor with respect, refrain from disruptive behaviors, listen to the lecture, and participate in classroom discussions. Student Requirements

(1) SUBSCRIBE TO BLOG - At our class homepage, in the blue bar at the top of the page, you will see the heading “Class Information.” This is a blog and you need to subscribe to it. To do this, click on “Class Information,” then click on “Subscribe,” check “By email,” and then click “Subscribe.” That way any information I post about class activities will not only appear at the top of our class homepage, but also be sent to you in an email to your TC email account.

(2) TESTS – Tests will be taken online and can be taken at home or at any computer with an internet connection. **There will be a one hour time limit for each test.** Test questions will include information covered in the chapter summaries and assigned activities, as well as from movies that may be assigned for you to view. Questions will be multiple choice and short answer/essay.

(3) ACTIVITIES - There will be several activities assigned this semester. Activities will involve such things as reading a handout and responding to it, watching a movie, and responding to questions about it, or finding a research article about a topic discussed in class. Each activity will be found at the “Course Organizer” at our Jenzabar class homepage, and will be explained in class and in messages sent to the class (for those who choose to do the class online).

(4) ATTENDANCE - Attendance will be based on completion of the activities and exams by their due dates. Failure to send in an activity by its due date or take an exam by its due date will constitute an absence. You are allowed 4 absences before being dropped from the course.

Grading Scale:

Grades by total points or grades by grade average (total points divided by 8):

Absentee Policy:

Failure to send in an activity or take an exam by its due date will count as an absence. You are allowed 4 absences. **STUDENTS WHOSE ABSENCES EXCEED THIS LIMIT WILL BE DROPPED FROM THE COURSE BY THE INSTRUCTOR.** It is the student’s responsibility to keep up with absences, and to check with the Admissions office to see if they have exceeded their absences and have been dropped from the course.

Make-up Policy:

Tests - Make-up tests will be taken online, at any computer with an internet connection. Students who do not take tests by the due dates will have one week to take the make-up test. Students taking make-up tests will be given a **45 minute time limit** for the test.

Activities – Activities handed in up to one week late will be graded at half-credit, and receive no credit after that.

Academic Dishonesty Policy:

Scholastic dishonesty, involving but not limited to cheating on a test, plagiarism, collusion, or falsification of records will make the student liable for disciplinary action after being investigated by the Dean of Students. Proven violations of this nature will result in the student being dropped from the class with an “F.” This policy applies campus wide, including the TC Testing Center, as well as off-campus classroom or lab sites, including dual credit campuses. Computer Requirement Policy:

Students are required to have a computer with Internet access for classes. The computer must be an actual computer – smart phones, iPads, Androids, Chromebooks, etc., are not acceptable substitutes because they lack software compatibility necessary to complete all assignments and tests. Financial costs for the necessary equipment and internet access are the responsibility of the student.

Students needing to purchase a computer may do so through the Texarkana College Bookstore. Systems purchased through the bookstore meet or exceed all requirements, are competitively priced, and may be purchased using financial aid funds. If the system is purchased through another source, it is the student's responsibility to ensure the system meets all requirements.

Computer systems requirements:

- Webcam, microphone, and speakers or headphones
- Windows 10 or a recent version of Mac OS (minimum Sierra). Windows 10 S mode is not supported
- Hardware capable of running Microsoft Teams (free download) and supports multi-media playback
- Support for Chrome or Microsoft Edge – Note: Firefox, Safari, or other browsers may not work on all TC applications
- Able to run Microsoft Office which will be provided free to TC students
- Adobe Reader or another PDF viewer
- Antivirus software such as Windows Defender or another 3rd party anti-virus solution
- The Respondus Lockdown browser is used for taking tests; therefore, the system must be capable of running this software. Most newer systems that meet other specifications should work.
- Students should regularly backup content to prevent loss of coursework due to hardware failure. Backup copies of documents and other coursework may be placed on OneDrive cloud storage. OneDrive is included free of charge for all TC students.

Alternate Operations during Campus Closure
