**Course Description**: This course is designed to introduce students to the systematic and scientific study of the behavior and mental processes of human beings and other animals. Students are exposed to the psychological facts, principles, and phenomena associated with each of the major subfields within psychology.

**Course Objective**: To understand the connections between the mind and body and the appropriate application of psychological principles in daily life while developing a personal awareness of values, character, and current and future goals. To have a basic working knowledge of human lifespan development and understanding of major personality theories and associated environmental factors as well as a knowledge base of the major concepts of general psychology.

#### Social and Behavioral Sciences Objective:

The objective of a social and behavioral science component of a core curriculum is to increase students' knowledge of how social and behavioral scientists discover, describe, and explain the behaviors and interactions among individuals, groups, institutions, events, and ideas. Such knowledge will better equip students to understand themselves and the roles they play in addressing the issues facing humanity.

- 1. To employ the appropriate methods, technologies, and data that social and behavioral scientists use to investigate the human condition.
- 2. To examine social institutions and processes across a range of historical periods, social structures, and cultures.
- 3. To use and critique alternative explanatory systems or theories.
- 4. To develop and communicate alternative explanations or solutions for contemporary social issues.
- 5. To analyze the effects of historical, social, political, economic, cultural, and global forces on the area under study.
- 6. To identify and understand differences and commonalities within diverse cultures.

## **Evaluation & Grading**:

Unit tests, quizzes, projects, and writing assignments. Students will be required to answer warmup questions or thoughts for the day to be considered part of the daily grade. A self-reflection term paper is required and due IN CLASS on the date shown in the assignment explanation.
