Student Learning Outcomes for the Course

Students should be able to:

- 1. Perform order of operations problems with exponents.
- 2. Perform arithmetic operations with integers.
- 3. Perform arithmetic operations with decimal numbers.
- 4. Perform arithmetic operations with fractions.
- 5. Simplify algebraic expressions by combining like terms.
- 6. Solve linear equations in one variable.
- 7. Perform application problems with one or more steps.
- 8. Solve a proportion application.
- 9. Convert fractions to percents.
- 10. Solve problems involving percents.

Student Requirements for Completion of the Course and Due Dates

Homework assignments are to be completed using MyMathLab (MML). Assignments should be completed <u>before midnight</u> on the posted due date (normally the next class day). All due dates will be posted on MyMathLab. You will not be able to earn credit for homework assignments after the due date has passed. At the end of the semester your lowest 3 homework grades will be dropped and will not count towards your homework average. Even though the homework is online, you should still work your homework problems on paper. I suggest keeping all homework assignments and handouts organized in a binder where they will be readily accessible. Tests – There will be a total of 7 major test grades as follows: Test 1: Chapters 1 & 2 Test 2: Chapter 3 Test 3: Chapter 4 Test 4: Chapter 5 Test 5: Chapter 7 Test 6: Solving Equations Test 7: Your Lab Grade will count as your 7th test grade (see Lab Grade below)

Each chapter test is multiple choice. Chapter tests will be either paper or online and may be given either in the classroom or in the testing center. The instructor will inform students of where to take each test. Students MUST take the test during the time period given by the instructor.

Final Exam – There will be a multiple choice comprehensive Final Exam given in class during last week of the semester. You will need to bring your own scantron for the final exam. Practice final exams are available for purchase in the bookstore.

*The use of calculators is NOT allowed in this course for any type of assignment (homework, test, final exam, etc.)

Absentee Policy

Texarkana College's absentee policy allows instructors to withdraw a student from a course due to excessive absences. If a student leaves and returns during class or leaves the class before the class is over, he/she may be considered tardy. Three tardies count as one absence.

Students are expected to attend each meeting of their registered courses. Faculty members **are not** obligated to provide opportunities for students to make-up missed assignments and tests as a result of a student's absence from class.

A student should not stop attending a class without formally withdrawing from the course by the institutions published Last Day for Students to Drop. If a student stops attending class after the published Last Day for Students to Drop, the student **may** receive a grade of "F" in the class. The instructor will submit the last date of attendance for students receiving a grade of "F" or "W".

Withdrawal from a course(s) **may** affect a student's current or future financial aid eligibility. Students should consult the Financial Aid Office to learn both short and long term consequences of a withdrawal.

MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE ABSENCES

After official registration, for Academic classes that meet twice a week, an instructor may withdraw a student from a course if they exceed <u>4 absences</u>. This means if you reach 5 absences you may be dropped from the course.

EXCUSED ABSENCES

The only absences that are considered excused and will not be counted against a student's allowable number of absences are absences due to school trips and/or school business or absences for military duty and Holy Days (FBD LEGAL), which are covered in a separate section of the catalog and the student handbook. These are the only excused absences that are considered by Texarkana College. Responsibility for work missed for any absence is placed on the student. Instructors are required to allow students to make up work missed if the absence is due to military duty or religious holy days when students follow the correct notification procedures. Instructors are not required to allow students to make up work for absences due to other reasons. If you have an emergency that causes you to miss multiple classes please contact your instructor as soon as possible.

Make-up Policy

Students may make up missed tests if the absence is due to military duty or religious holy days when students notify the instructor prior to being absent. There will be no make-up exams for absences due to other reasons. Any test missed will be recorded as a zero. Any student missing 3 major tests will be dropped from the course.

If your final exam grade is higher than one of your chapter test grades, the final exam grade will replace the lower test score. (This means if you do miss <u>a</u> test (meaning one test only),

the 0 can be replaced with the score from your final exam) You will not receive credit for homework assignments after the due date has passed. At the end of the semester your lowest 3 homework grades will be dropped and will not count towards your homework average

Course Correspondence:

Course correspondence will be through TC student email, MyMathLab, or the email address you provide when creating your MyMathLab account. It is the student's responsibility to check his/ her email and MyMathLab account regularly for any communication related to the course.

A student may be dropped from the course for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Missing 5 classes
- 2. Missing 3 major tests
- 3. Missing 5 required weeks of lab time
- 4. Any breach of classroom conduct (see student handbook)

Lab Time:

Beginning the first full week of the semester each student is required to complete a minimum of one hour (60 minutes) of lab time per calendar week. Your hour does not have to be completed in one session. You may accumulate time during the week by going to the Math Lab located on the first floor of the Library across from Student Support Services. **You will be dropped from the course if you fail to complete 5 weeks of lab time.**

<u>Math Lab</u>: The Math Lab is a good place for doing homework. There are computers available as well as free Math tutors. In order for your Math Lab time to be counted you must sign in each time you enter the Lab <u>and sign out</u> each time you leave the lab. If you fail to sign out your time will be deleted. The Math Lab will provide me with a copy of the sign in each week, you do not have to bring anything to me for your time to be counted.

Math Lab hours of operation for this semester are:

Sundays 2:00 pm – 8:00 pm – Tutors may or may not be available on Sundays. If no tutors are present you must request access to the math lab at the library circulation desk in order to have your lab time counted.

Lab Grade:

- Each student will begin the semester with a lab grade of 100. Each week that you do not complete your assigned lab, 10 points will be deducted from your lab grade. Make sure you add up your time for the week to check that it adds up to a full <u>60 minutes</u>. You must accumulate a total of 60 minutes to get your lab credit for the week. If you complete less than 60 minutes for the week, you will not receive credit for completing lab for that week.
- Lab time does not roll over to the next week! If you complete extra time one week, it will not count towards your time the next week. Your lab time is counted Sunday through Saturday, then starts over the next week.
- At the end of the semester your lab grade will count as your 7th test grade and may not be replaced with the grade from your final exam.
- Students who make a grade of <u>80 or above</u> on a major test will be exempt from the lab requirement until the results of the next test are known. Students who score a 79 or below on a major test must continue to accumulate one hour of lab time per week until the results of the next test are known.
- You may make up **one** week of lab time during the last week of class (the week before finals). You must complete 90 minutes (or 1.5 hours) of lab time to make up for the previously missed week.

**You must be working on math while in the Math Lab for your time to be counted. If you are working on anything other than math (this includes playing on your phone), your entire time for that session will be deleted! If you argue with the lab attendants, you may be asked to leave the lab. In other words...Don't act like a fool!
