

Syllabus: Art Appreciation Course Number: ARTS 1301 Semester & Year: Master Syllabus Instructor Information

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#### **Course Description**

This course is on the appreciation of art. The content is based on looking at works of art. The objective of this is to broaden and enlighten the cultural background of the student.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes**

- 1. Students will learn different artistic time periods and the artists and media associated with each period.
- 2. Students will express opinions/knowledge of artist/art periods through summaries.
- 3. Students will complete study questions for each required unit.
- 4. Students will complete a lab notebook that incorporates the elements and principles of design, demonstrating their ability to follow directions and interpret their knowledge from textbook and lectures.
- 5. Students will experiment with various media concentrating on artists and styles from lectures and visual material.
